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1. Purpose of the Seminar

The Seminar on Economic Policies aims at helping participating countries to develop their human resources, through the dissemination of knowledge regarding the Japanese social and economic system to young executive candidates from the Ministries of Finance of developing countries with which Japan has close social and economic relations.

2. Term of the Seminar

From May 16 to June 10, 2016

3. Organizer

The Policy Research Institute (PRI), Ministry of Finance (MOF), Japan

4. Seminar Venue

The seminar will in principle be held in the main building of the MOF in Tokyo, except for visits and field trips.

5. Language

The seminar will be conducted in English.

6. Curriculum (tentative)

(1) Policy Lectures (Japan's Economic and Fiscal Policies, etc.)

The lectures will be conducted by:

- Officials from the MOF/PRI and other relevant government organizations.
- Scholars and experts from outside the government on subjects related to the economy and finance.

(2) General Lectures (about Japan)

The lectures will be conducted by scholars and experts on subjects related to Japanese culture and society. Japanese language classes will be included.

(3) Group Studies for Group Policy Paper

Participants will be divided into several groups, according to the topics that they select at the stage of application. Aim of the group studies are to set up the common issues among group members and to make a policy recommendation to those issues through active discussion. Each group study will be held under the guidance of a scholar or expert. (Refer to 7. *Group Policy Paper*)

(4) Visits and Field Trips

Visits and field trips to institutions in Tokyo which are related to finance and economy will be organized. Also, the field trip to Kyoto and Osaka is planned for the participants to know the traditional Japanese cultures as well as visit to Japan Mint etc.

(5) Country Report

Each participant will be required to <u>make a brief presentation on his/her own</u> <u>country (within 10 slides in MS Power Point)</u> to other participants (10-minute presentation and 5-minute question & answer) in the first week of the seminar. This is intended to help the participants share knowledge and introduce themselves. The presentation materials should be submitted to the PRI <u>by April 22 (FRI)</u>, <u>2016</u> The contents to be included are:

(a) a cover page;

- (b) a brief explanation on the fiscal and macroeconomic situations;
- (c) the organization chart/ structure of the fiscal authority;
- (d) fiscal/ financial ODA needs; and
- (e) challenges or problems your country are currently working on
- (f) anything helpful for understanding his/her country.

For further information on (1) to (5) above, please refer to **Reference 1** (tentative curriculum for 2016) as well as **Reference 2** (time table 2015) and **Reference 3** (sample of country report).

7. Group Policy Paper

As for the group studies (6(3)), each group will be required to make a presentation based on active discussion among group members. Each group will prepare a presentation material which is regarded as the <u>"Group Policy Paper"</u>. Each group must include on the paper what they have learned through the seminar, such as analysis of Japan's policies systems and/or experiences, and also provide policy suggestions to his/her own country. The procedure will be as follows:

[In the application form (See **Appendix 1**)]

- (1) To select **ONE** topic among the following;;
 - (A) Public Finance (Tax System, Fiscal Consolidation, etc.)
 - (B) Role of Fiscal Policy in Economic Growth (Public Investment,

Economic Stimulus Package, etc.)

- (C) Role of Public Funding in Developing Countries (*Fiscal Investment and Loan Program ('FILP'), Policy Financial Corporation, etc.)
 - * FILP in Public Finance means the following concepts
 - · Financial tools aiming at strategically targeted policy objectives
 - Complement to private sector in quantities of LT financing
 - Preferential rates reflecting policy priorities

[Before the seminar]

- (2) To prepare the <u>"individual policy paper"</u> on the topic above and submit it to the PRI <u>by April 15 (FRI), 2016</u> (See Reference 4 for the format. <u>Please</u> <u>type into this format to complete the individual policy paper. Handwritten</u> <u>paper is not acceptable</u>);
- (3) Participants will be divided into several groups, according to the topics that they select.
- Note: The individual policy papers will be shared among your group members and instructor beforehand to make the group studies more meaningful. So before coming to Japan, please read the other participants policy papers and consider the common issues that could be set up within your group.
 - Basically, we divide participants into several groups by the topics they select. If we have difficulty to meet each participant's first choice, we may contact with you when arranging groups.

[During the seminar]

- (4) To receive instructions from the instructor, and have active discussions among the group members about the common issues each group set up. Group studies will be held three times during the seminar;
- (5) To complete the <u>"Group Policy Paper"</u> and submit it in a form of electronic file to the PRI by the given deadline (See **Reference 5** for the format); and
- (6) To make a group presentation to instructor(s), other participants (groups), and PRI executives, and receive comments and advices from them (40-minute presentation and 20-minute question & answer).

8. Certificate

Each participant who has successfully completed the curriculum of this seminar will receive a certificate from the PRI. The following conditions must be satisfied in order to receive the certificate;

- (1) To attend all the lectures, visits (and field trips) and group studies; and
- (2) To submit the group policy paper by the given deadline.

Note: The PRI reserves the discretion to issue a certificate with some conditions, or not to issue it, taking account of the performance of each participant.

9. Seminar Participants

About 20-25officials of Ministries of Finance or relevant institutions from Asia

10. Applicant Qualifications

Each applicant should:

- (1) be an official of the Ministry of Finance or relevant institution in his/her home country, preferably with more than eight years' job experience in the field of economic policy;
- (2) preferably have a master degree in economics, although a candidate holding a bachelor degree or equivalent educational background is also acceptable;
- (3) have a sufficient command of English to understand the lectures as well as to discuss with other participants and make presentations. As a guide: TOEFL score of over 79 in the Internet-Based Testing (over 213 in Computer-Based Testing, and over 550 in Paper-Based Testing), TOEIC score of over 760, IELTS score of over 6.5 or equivalent;
- (4) be <u>under</u> 40 years of age;
- (5) have no previous experience of a similar training course in Japan; and
- (6) also be in good health, both physically and mentally; free from any contagious disease or any other medical condition that might impair attendance at the seminar.
- * It is desirable that applicants meet all of the above qualifications.

11. Application Procedure

Please recommend <u>ONE</u> official to the PRI.

To streamline the selection process, please submit in advance <u>digital data or a</u> <u>copy of all the documents below</u> to the PRI <u>via E-mail</u>, <u>by January 25 (MON)</u>, <u>2016.</u> In addition, <u>the original documents also should be sent to the PRI</u>, using a postal service which you will be able to track such as DHL.

[Documents to be sent]

(1) Completed Application Form (See Appendix 1);

(2) One Letter of Recommendation (in English, arbitrary format) from <u>a</u> senior official of the personnel affairs division of the applicant's organization; and

(3) Completed Medical History Questionnaire (See Appendix 2)

12. Selection

The results of the selection will be delivered to the applicant's organization <u>by</u> <u>March 14 (MON), 2016, at the latest</u>. The invitation letter will be sent later as well.

13. Expenses and Allowances

The PRI will cover the following expenses for each participant:

(1) Round-trip, economy-class airfare between Japan and an international airport designated by the PRI in each participant's country;

Note: The airfare covered by the PRI does <u>not</u> include any excess baggage charge. Such extra charges must be borne by the participant.

(2) Accommodation cost including breakfast;

(3) Transportation cost between Narita International Airport or Haneda Airport and the accommodation as well as between the accommodation and the seminar venue;

- (4) Field trip expenses related to the seminar; and
- (5) Health insurance
 - Note: The insurance covers medical and hospital expenses up to JPY 6 million. However, it does <u>not</u> cover expenses incurred in connection with <u>preexisting</u> <u>conditions</u>, such as pregnancy, dental treatment, physical disability, or previous mental instability. It will cover only those costs for bodily injury or sickness arising after arrival in Tokyo. Details shall be determined by the insurance company.
- (6) Per diem

The PRI will provide each participant with per diem subject to the PRI accounting policy (in the case of the last seminar, average JPY 3,000 per day). This per diem is intended to cover the costs of meals and incidental expenses.

Note: The PRI does <u>not</u> bear the expenses relating to the entry visa to Japan, such as the application fee and the cost of transportation to visit the Embassy of Japan that has jurisdiction over the participant's home country.

14. Accommodation

The PRI will arrange accommodations located in Tokyo and field trip destinations, i.e. Kyoto, Osaka. Internet Access Service and breakfast are provided.

15. Items provided to each participant by PRI

A personal computer (Windows model, with Microsoft Word, Excel, and PowerPoint)

Note: We do <u>not</u> provide participants with mobile phones during the seminar. If you need to contact your family or colleagues immediately during the seminar, please use your own mobile phone.

16. Regulations

All participants are required:

- to strictly observe the seminar schedule;
- <u>not</u> to bring any family members;
- to come to Japan at the beginning of the seminar and return to their home country at the end of the seminar according to the travel schedule

designated by the PRI in advance;

- to refrain from smoking in the MOF building, except in designated smoking areas;
- to refrain from engaging in political activities or any form of employment for profit or gain;
- to discontinue participation in the seminar in the event of serious illness or being judged unable to continue by the PRI; and
- to discontinue participation in the seminar in the event of engaging in any illegal or immoral activities.






